




Preference on English grammar

Sometimes you need to state a preference when someone makes a **suggestion**, **offers** something, or asks your **opinion** about what to do.



PREFERENCE



There are commonly 4 ways of expressing preference on English grammar, where people tend to pick their choices based on it

Those are:

- > . . . like . . . better than . . .
- > . . . prefer . . . to . . .
- > . . . would rather . . . than . . .
- > . . . would prefer to . . . rather than . . .



The Rules

like – better than

- S + like + N + better than + N
- S + like + Gerund + better than + Gerund

prefer – to

- S + prefer + N + to + N
- S + prefer + Gerund + to + Gerund

would rather – than

S + would rather + Infinitive + than + Infinitive

would prefer to – rather than

S + would prefer to + Infinitive + rather than + Infinitive

NOTES

- S = subject
- N = noun (k.benda)
 e.g.: book, coffee,
 chandelier
- Gerund = V+ing
- Infinitive = V1



For Example

like – better than

I like tea better than coffee.

prefer – to

She prefers reading to watching TV.

would rather – than

They would rather stay at home than go to the party.

would prefer to – rather than

We would prefer to work in the morning rather than in the evening.












